



SSA Weather policy

Severe weather or adverse Field conditions may cause the suspension or cancellation of Training Sessions &/or Games. If lightning is observed or thunder is heard during a Training Session &/or Game, the Referee &/or Program Supervisors will suspend the Training Session &/or Game. The Referee &/or Program Supervisors will not allow Play to continue until lightning has been absent from the local sky and thunder has not been heard for 30 minutes. All Players, Coaches, and Spectators will clear the Field immediately, and seek shelter during the delay. In the case of rain (or sleet!) Squads & Teams should always be prepared for the prevailing or unexpected weather conditions. In the event of cold weather, sweatshirts without hoods may be worn under Jerseys. Knit caps and gloves may be worn.

Different weather conditions may exist at different SSA Fields on the same night. It is always best to report to your Training Session &/or Game location on time and be prepared to Play. The Referee &/or the Program Supervisors will make the decision as to whether the Training Session &/or Game will take place and inform everyone on site. It is impossible to predict the Marquette area weather. We do heavily rely upon the weather forecast. Our SSA Weather Committee will do their best to decide as to the cancellation of Training Sessions &/or Games for the evening, if inclement weather is predicted for the entire evening. Also, the cancellation of an early evening Training Session &/or Game at a given Field, does not necessarily mean a later Training Session &/or Game at that same Field will be cancelled. We do NOT reschedule missed Training Sessions OR Games.
